SUBJECT AND OBJECT PRONOUNS

- I
- you
- he
- she
- it
- we
- you (plur)
- they

- me
- you
- him
- her
- it

SUBJECT – VERB– DIRECT OBJECT

- He loves her
- I love him
- We love them
- She loves us
- You love it
- They love you

SUBJECT - VERB - DIRECT OBJECT - INDIRECT OBJECT

- He gives it to me
- You give it to her
- They give it to us
- We give it to them

PREPOSITIONS

The object form of pronouns is used after all prepositions

eg for me near her with him after us behind you underneath them

Two pronouns after a preposition

- for you and her
- before him and me
- between you and me
- after you and me
- because of you and me

Noun and pronoun after a preposition

- He gave it to my mother and me
- You can borrow it after John and me
- It's a matter between my wife and me
- Come shopping with Carol and me
- My father cares for my brother and me

Two pronouns as subject

- He and she did it together
- You and I will do it
- He and I went to the pictures yesterday
- They and he met in Nice

Noun and pronoun as subject

- John and I are engaged
- The boys and she are in town
- My mother and I saw it together
- The teacher and he had a disagreement
- We and the musicians had a drink

TWO PRONOUNS AS OBJECT

- Jim saw him and me together
- The Alsatian greeted her and us with a bark
- Meet me and him in the park
- Don't believe them or me

NOUN AND PRONOUN AS OBJECT

- He asked the dentist and her to dinner
- You asked my mother and me to do it
- They saw the milkman and me together
- He won't believe Peter or me
- Call John and me at nine
